Decision on Water Supply Application No. 6862

Applicant - VILLAGE OF PAINTED POST - 7th Application

Application filed with the Department on April 10, 1978

PROJECT and LOCATION

Vernon J. Patterson, Mayor of the Village of Painted Post, Steuben County, acting in the name and on behalf of that Village, asks the approval of this Department to extend its water supply and distribution mains to a permissive service area outside of the village limits and for the taking of a supply of water for use in this extension from its existing sources.

It is proposed to install approximately 1,500 feet of 8-inch water main from an existing main to a proposed Howard Johnson Restaurant to be built west of the village, within the Town of Erwin. In addition to normal restaurant use of water, expected to average about 12,240 gallons per day, a fire protection sprinkler system and fire hydrants will be installed. The existing village system can readily furnish the normal daily use, together with satisfactory fire flows, in addition to existing needs.

This project does not require review pursuant to Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law (State Environmental Quality Review), and pursuant to Article 70 of the Environmental Conservation Law (Uniform Procedures), it has been determined that no other Department permits are required, that the project is a minor project, and that no public notice is required.

PROJECT REVIEW

The application and supporting papers submitted having been reviewed by the Department and by the New York State Department of Health and the application, maps and plans, as modified by the conditions contained herein, having been found to meet the statutory requirements of Environmental Conservation Law, Section 15-1503, subdivision 4, the applicant is hereby authorized to carry out the project as described above subject to such modifications and conditions as herein set forth. Final plans and specifications have also been reviewed and are satisfactory.

CONDITIONS

A. The Department reserves the right to rescind the approval being given under this decision or to take whatever action it may deem suitable and proper if the works authorized to be constructed herein are not initiated by 6/1/80.

- Section 15-1529 of the Environmental Conservation Law forbids the operation of any of these works until, as constructed, they have been approved by the Department. Such final approval will be given only on written request. In general, such approval will not be given until all provisions affecting quality of the water and safety of the works have been complied with in full.
- C. The Department reserves the right to reconsider this approval at any time and after due notice and hearing at that time to continue, rescind or modity this decision in such a manner as may be found to be just and equitable.
- Provisions shall be made to minimize erosion during the construction of the project and to prevent increased sedimentation in any water body on or adjacent to the project.
- E. Water used for disinfecting mains, if discharged to area streams, must have a chlorine residual not exceeding 0.05 mg/l at point of discharge.
- Granting of this approval does not relieve the applicant of the responsibility of obtaining any other permission, consent or approval which may be required.

WHEREFORE, the Department of Environmental Conservation hereby approves the said application, maps and plans as herein modified.
